## Covid19 Daily Update

Rotation of staff for essential and emergent work:

The question was raised by the trade union representatives today about the rotation of staff when carrying out essential and emergent works to support site safety & security

Staff will be rotated on these works with a 50% rotation of staff per week, the reasons for 50% is as follows:

- We need to maintain the knowledge of the job being carried out
- It gives an opportunity for the work to be shared amongst the teams
- A number of people are requesting to work to assist in their mental health
- This work will be offered to those who are SQEP'd for the work and are not identified as vulnerable

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## Covid19 Supply Chain update 22 April 2020

Sellafield Ltd is extending its pause of project construction work for a further week until 4 May. The time will be used for further planning and preparation work to consider limited restarts on the BEPPS/DIF and SRP project, in addition to continuing any emergent work needed to maintain the functionality of the site and, of course, keep it safe and secure.

In addition to the six-stage model previously shared, the chart below (which can be found in 'Our Sellafield' magazine at <https://files.sellafieldsite.co.uk/os/2020/april/4/>) shows how the various phases to ramp up work that will lead to a return to normal operations – *only when the time is right to do so*. We are now starting to plan and consider the key activities that could form part of phase 3.

Sellafield is delivering work which is vital for our national infrastructure and safety. That means we've been able to maintain earnings throughout our supply chain to ensure it remains capable of responding to deliver the site's strategic priorities – in line with Government guidance and always being aware of the wider situation in the region and the country.

During the rest of this month, we'll be considering future limited restarts, including discussions with the Trades Unions and application of Government guidance, and will communicate any further decisions by 30 April.

The extension is applicable to all NAECI and CIJC employees except for:

- those currently working on site, and as previously communicated
- those required for emergent works, which will be reviewed on a case by case basis


For the remainder of the workforce, you should remain available for work during this period (in line with the Guarantee provisions in NAECI and CIJC, under which you will continue to be paid) though we will give a minimum of 24 hours' notice if we require you to come into site.

We will provide further updates about how site work progresses in due course. Official Sellafield Ltd comms are expected shortly.
